July 20th Resilient Forestry Tour

Visit a working model of the future of forestry

Eugene, ORE. – Beyond Toxics and the owner of Shady Creek Forest in Western Lane County, Oregon will host a Resilient Forestry Tour on Saturday, July 20th from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm.

This tour provides the *community a unique opportunity to look inside a sustainably-managed forest and see how this approach creates healthy ecosystems and sequesters carbon while sustaining healthy air and water in the face of climate change.* David Eisler, owner of the Willow-Witt Ranch will guide community members through a working forest and wetland and highlight their management practices that focus on non-toxic management, environmental protection, wildlife and botanical biodiversity, and carbon storage. Topics such as caring for rich soil and honoring the development of slow growth trees and undisturbed wetlands without the use of synthetic herbicides and fertilizers will be discussed. Beyond Toxics Executive Director Lisa Arkin will provide more context on the issue of how climate change can be mitigated by resilient forestry practices and the role of forestry to reduce carbon emissions.
